MOUNT NANGA PARBAT CONQUERED.

Pakistan Flag Hoisted.

Austrian Scales 26,660-foot Giant.

Gilgit, July 6th: The 26,660-foot Nanga Parbat has been conquered by the Austro-German expedition.

According to information reaching here today the giant Himalayan peak which had hitherto repulsed eight attempts at its conquest was scaled on July 4th. at 10 in the morning by a veteran Austrian climber, Hermann Buhl, one of the nine-man expedition.

Reaching the top in clear blue sky Hermann Buhl planted the flags of Pakistan and Federal Republic of Germany on the summit and there stood there for a few minutes.

Lying on the outer fringes of the Himalayas Nanga Parbat has been a challenge to the mountaineers all over the world, since the later half of the 19th. century.

Eight major attempts had been previously made to break the pride of the mountain but they all fell through, two of them in the years of 1934 and 1937 ended in complete disaster of expeditions.

With its conquest, another giant in the Himalayas, has fallen. The mighty and glorious though inhospitable mountain has at last obliged and bowed down to the persistent efforts of the man to conquer the nature.

Its resplendent silver crest still shines gracefully, nearly five miles high in the blue sky, but is short of much of the legend which this name has come to signify.

The scornful lines on its age worn hoary forehead look deeper today, but the sting in their scorn is gone and perished for ever.

A man has at last brought its proud summit to his feet. Wringing its crown of fame, he decorated his own head with it. A pride is broken and a new one created. A legend is made at the cost of an old one.
