The Dukes of Norfolk and Edinburgh captained opposing sides at Arundel Castle, both with enough England players to make Australia tremble. Bill Edrich and John Langridge opened for the Duke of Norfolk 's eleven, and 30,000 admission-free spectators eventually saw the Earl Marshal go out to bat on his own private ground. The Duke of Ed'bro, whose off spinners were once priased by Bradman, was attacking the other end.
