A Convair B.36 came down in the Atlantic, ~~two~~ engines ablaze, 450 miles West of Ireland.

U.S. air stations in Scotland and elsewhere dispatched planes to search the area. Twenty R.A.F. aircraft joined in. Four survivors were picked up and the bodies of
