Two-Hour Queue For Tickets

Although there will be accommodation for nearly 1400 persons at the ceremony at which Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother will receive the freedom of Inverness on Thurs-day, the hall will not be nearly large enough to accommodate all who desire to attend.

When the first allocation of tickets to the public was made tickets to the public was made yesterday forenoon they were disposed of within a few minutes to to people who had minutes to people who had queued for two hours or more, despite the fact that the distribution was restricted to two tickets per person and was later reduced to one. When it was announced shortly afterwards that no more tickets would be available for the public some of those who had been dis-appointed protested at the meagre allocation which they claimed had been made available to the public for seats at the freedom ceremony.

Guard of Honour
