Newman Rolls are loading supplies onto Sunderland at Malta shots in flight - Air shots over Zante. Unloading and loading stores at Zante. The Base Operations ship R.N. - H.M.S. BERMUDA. (Cruiser) Shots onshore of R.N. Demolition Squad blowing up wreckage - and U.S. troops cleaning streets. Helicopter taking off - Helicopter shots over remote parts of island where they dropped leaflets stating that help was on the way and not to panic -

The Cyprus Roll concerns the South camp on the island made possible by H.M.S. BERMUDA and USS LOCKBRIDGE who arrived at Zante on Friday Piled high with stones and transport by the afternoon they built the camp on the football ground and since then 20,000 hot meals have been served and 3,500 people inoculated - The three officers shot in groups are W. + R. Lieut Dugan USM. Capt King R.M. & Lt Savill R.M.
