Facilities

EDINBURGH, Nov. 1

When the Duke of Edinburgh is installed as Chancellor of Edinburgh University on Wednesday, the ceremony will take place in the McEwan Hall, one of the most striking pieces of architecture in the Scottish capital. The spacious graduation centre, which has been in use since 1897, has been restored internally to reveal the full beauty of the decorative murals. The original electric organ has been rebuilt to coincide with the redecoration of the hall.

The first duty of the Duke of Edinburgh after being installed will be to confer honorary degrees on distinguished people, among whom will be Marshal of the R.A.F. Lord Tedder, Admiral of the Fleet Lord Fraser of North Cape, Field-Marshal Lord Alanbrooke, the Duke of Hamilton, the Duke of Buccleuch, Lord Rosebery, Sir Alexander Fleming, F.R.S., Rector of the University, Sir James Miller, Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and Mr. Kurt Hahn, former headmaster of Gordonstoun School. On the following day the Duke of Edinburgh will declare open the new home of the Scottish Central Library in the Lawnmarket. The library, which was endowed by Mr. Andrew Carnegie, has been transferred from Dunfermline, Fifeshire, and will serve as a central reservoir for all libraries. Its new premises are in a former tenement about 250 years old, and the reconstruction work has provided a building that greatly enhances the architectural interest of the Royal Mile.
