Former warriors of the Jewish faith mustered on Horse Guards Parade for the Annual service of Remembrange. Field Marshal Lord Alexander was the inspecting officer. Hero of World War I was Major Sir J. Brunnel Cohen, a British Legion Treasurer for 25 years. Not even Boer War Veterans were the oldest present; two or three on parade fought in Rhodesia 60 gears ago. In the wreathslaying party was a man holding the highest valour-award, Lieutenant Gould, V.C. Rowsvar. The Chief Rabbi the Very Reverend Israel Brodie, conducted the service. From all parts of the United Kingdom came these members of the Association of Jewish Ex-Servicemen, paying tribute at hm the Cenotaph to comrades who died in battle, that freedom should not perish from the earth. In every country where the Jewish Faith flourishes tyranny cannot survive, liberty must triumph.
