The Hydro-Electric Scheme on the River Garry, Inverness-shire. is going in for salmon rearing in a big way. Mechanical traps collect the salmon as they make for spawning grounds now destroyed by the scheme's developments. The North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board is making sure that kilowatts aren't obtained at the cost of salmon. Each female in the trap is carried to what they call the stripping shed, where the eggs are taken from it. Sal mon aren't niggardly in the matter of eggs. They think nothing of laying 5-to-6-hundred for every pound of their own weight. At that rate the world would soon contain salmon and nothing else, but most of the babies get eaten up in the sea, which is the way nature manages things. The eggs go into hatcheries, taking between 3-and-5-months to incubate, The fry, as the baby salmon are disrespectfully called, will then be put into the locks and rivers. There show be a selmon shortage.
