PUSAN FIRE MAKES 26,000 HOMELESS

One sixth of the South Korean port of Pusan lies allbut obliterated after the 12-hour fire. It was a quarter mainly consisting of wooden dwellings, many of them ho better than huts. The plight of the homeless, estimated at 26,000, is pitiful. To shelter so large a number would be a tremendous problem at any time. Now, with the normal population of 400,000 swollen to almost a million by war-refugees At's mak practically impossible. . The blaze is said to have been started by cinders from a woman's stove. In high wind it spread, uncontrollable as a prairie fire. Only four people were burnet to death and, considering the size of the salamity it's amening that no more than a 100 or so are injured. But to survivors this is disaster on a great scale.
