Ruin and destruction in Vicksburg, Mississippil A tornado swept through this Mississippi River port leaving rubble and debris in its wake.

This clock stopped as the storm ripped through the pre-holiday decorated business district — 12 blocks leveled, residences flattened, by the twister — worst of four that ravaged Mississippi, Louisiana and Arkansas.

In all 938 buildings destroyed or damaged; in Wicksburg alone - twelve hundred persons homeless!
