

ENGLAND V% ALL BLACKS

15 The 70,000 who saw England kick off at Twickenham regarded this game as the number one match of the All Blacks' tour, though not expecting Scots and Welshmen to agree with them. It was soon clear that the intense cold was if anything stimulating the players. The New Zealanders, intent on avenging ~~the~~ All-Blacks' defeat at Twickenham eighteen years ago, were on top form.
