Not even incomparable Sydney Harbour ever presented a scene to equal that which marked the arrival of the royal liner Gothic. The sea has always played a great part in the life of the great city; everything that could float came out to great the Queen.

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Werreigner along a two-mile lane formed by yachts the Queen and Duke headed towards Farm Cove, the historic place where the first Governor of New South Wales landed more than 150 years ago. Awaiting them were men whose mames are famous throughout the world. The Governor-General, Sir William Slim, welcomed Her Majesty on behalf of the whole Commentable of Australia, and after him came the Governor of New South Wales, our good friend the Prime Minister, Mr. Detect Menzies, and many that notables, of welcome.

Now came the triumphal drive through the great city to Government House. The decorations, on a scale far exceeding anything known in Australia before, cost £2,000,000.

At the cenotaph Her Majesty paused to pay tribute to

Australians killed in two world wars. Other nations may
have produced soldiers whose valour equalled theirs; no
country surpassed in them. The growd are und the Seme taph
numbered 40,000 and some broke through the police lines,

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At last the Royal car reached the old mansion, overlooking Sydney harbour, which is Government House. The joyous and historic day closed with the greatest firework display Sydney has ever witnessed.
