

NEW GRAB SPEEDS TIMBER OUTPUT

300 miles north of Montreal it's lumbering time in the Canadian International Paper Company's forests.

Horses drag logs to big dumps, where trailers 76 feet long are loaded with 80 tons of timber. The new claw-grab bites off 2-and-a-half tons at each mouthful.

The 275-h.p. trailers haul the loads over the ^{*hills*} ~~water~~ to the head waters of Wabano River. The timber's dumped on the ice till the river thaws, and next spring ~~when~~ it'd begin floating down

to the big mills at Three Rivers. There the wood's turned into and eventually becomes your morning and evening *paper.*
