INDO-CHINA NEWS FOCUS ON U. S. TECHNICIANS

United States aid to the Vietnamese and the French in their long war against the Reds is brought sharply into focus in latest news developments. American Air Force technicians are reported servicing U.S.-supplied equipment. Answering critics in the United States, President Eisenhower says every step the government takes in helping to fight the Reds in Indo-China is carefully calculated to keep the country from getting in too deep. The President says the American technicians are not combat troops and are to leave Indo-China by June 15th.
