ORANGE FREE STATE CELEBRATES CENTENARY

Bloemfontein and its neighbourhood was the happy hunting ground of wild game, now systematically preserved, when the Boers from Cape Colemystekked north to what is now the Orange Free State.

1000 horsemen dressed as their historic forebears, re-enacted the hat older of the his treks of the 1830s, as part of the Free State centenary celebrations. Traditional Dutch dances were featured and Bloemfontein itself, capital of the Free State, marked the 100th birthday in a big way. In 1854 Britain gave the new Boer settlement independence. Today the Union of South Africa has no prouder people then the inhabitants of the Orange Free State.
