Gordon yesterday began his new job as a travelling paint salesman, which gives him greater freedom for training and racing.

It also happens that his club have a very good team this year, with the young Civil Servant, Peter Driver, shaping like a champion of the future. He was only a few seconds behind Pirie in the Surrey race.
