## Interview No. 1

THIS IS MANOR AND MRS... AND.... I THINK, AND PETER. WOULD YOU TELL US, MAJOR, WHAT HAPPENED IN THE FIRST PLACE WHEN THE ALARM WENT.

WELL, I WAS IN THE CABIN ASLEEP AND THE STEWARD CAME IN AND TOLD US ALL GERTHICAL STSTEM TO GO ON DECK. THERE WAS NO ALARM BECHUSE THE SHIP HAD BROKEN DOWN. WE ALL WENT UP ON DECK AND MY WIFE AND CHILDREN WENT ON THE BOAT DECK AND WERE LOWERED INTO THE SEA. ... WENT DOWN RIGHT INTO LIFEBOAT WHICH WAS MOORED ALONGSIDE.

MRS..... WHAT HAPPENED TO YOU DURING THE TIME YOU WERE WAITING? DECK WE WENT UP ONTO THE/WITH... AND TWO CHILDREN AND WERE TOLD THAT WOMEN AND CHILDREN WOULD GO FIRST INTO THE LEFEBOAT. WE WERE LOWERED INTO ONE AND INTO THE SEA AND WE EXEX WERE PULLED AWAY AND THERE WERE TWO SAILORS IN THE LIFEBOAT..... WOMEN AND CHILDREN WENT FIRST. NATURALLY. WHEN DID YOU MEET UP AGAIN? IN ALGIERS. .. NORWEGIAN SHIP.

OH WELL, I MAKE NO STATEMENT AT ALL. THE ONLY THING I WISH TO SAY IS OF THE GOOD BEHAVIOUR OF EVERYONE ON BOARD THE SHIP.

Interview 3 ?

MAJOR AND MRS... AND THEIR FAMILY. TELL US ABOUT THE TROUBLE IN THE WINDRUSH MAJOR.

THE ONLY THING WE CAN SAY REALLY IS THAT WE WERE XYAKERCOXEX WAKENED UP AND I THINK THE STEWARDS CAME ROUND FIRST AND SAID YOU HAD BETTER GET UP ON DECK. WE SMELT, WE SMELT BURNING SMOKE AND THEN WE REALISED THAT IT WASN'T JUST A.... BUT IT WAS A....

WELL, WHERE DID YOU MEET UP WITH YOUR WIFE AFTERWARDS? AND WHERE DID YOU MANAGE TO MEET UP WITH YOUR WIFE AND FAMILY?

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I WAS RATHER SURPRISED.... AND WE WERE.... HIS WIFE AND BABY, AND WE MADE A FIRE AND WE WERE QUITE COMFORTABLE.

THEY LOOKED AFTER YOU WELL.

LOVELY. MUCH BETTER THAN I EXPECTED.

WELL YOU HAD BETTER KIT YOURSELVES UP AGAIN AND GET SOME ....

..MR. DARLING ? CHIEF PURSER. CHIEF PURSER.....BUT THE PRINCIPLE THING I SHOULD LIKE TO SAY IS HOW WONDERFUL EVERYBODY'S BEEN SINCE I LEFT THE SHIP, FROM ALGIERS TO EVERYWHERE ELSE. COMING DOWN THIN ROPE, GOT TWO THIRDS WAY DOWN WHEN LOST MY GRIP (NOISE OF PLANE) MAKES ME FEEL SO SCRUFFY BECAUSE I CAN'T DO ANYTHING.....

WELL YOU WERE INVOLVED MR. DARLING ? IN GETTING PEOPLE OFF SHIP. MY JOB TO GET ALL THE FAMILY, WOMEN AND CHILDREN OFF THE BOAT AND TO ORGANIZE OR HELP ORGANIZE.... OVER THE SIDE OF THE SHIP. EVERYBODY GOT AWAY PRETTY WELL. WONDERFUL CREW REALLY, WONDERFUL HELP BY PASSENGERS BECAUSE THEY WERE ALL SO CALM, THEY WERE ALL SO CALM. THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

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
