" ROYAL TOUR "

Making a break in the long flight from Queensland to South Australia, the Queen's constellations touches down near Broken Hill, the city built on silver.

(PAUSE)

On leaving the airport the Royal Couple see something of the desolate outback and of the pipeline that brings water to the thirsty "Hill".

(PAUSE)

A visit is made to the headquarters of the justly famous Flying Doctor Service.

(PAUSE)

Informal pictures of the Queen as she negotiates sand and wing tips to gain a closer look at one of the mercy planes. Last year sixty thousand miles were flown by this service, whose work is celebrated throughout the world.

(PAUSE)

The Royal Party flies across three states before reaching Parafield Airport. Now it's Adelaide's turn to play host to the Queen, who has already won the hearts of the eastern States with her Graciousness and charm. (PAUSE)

The Royal couple are greeted by the State Governor, Sir Robert George and Lady George.

(PAUSE)

Next day eager crowds see the Queen and Duke leave Government House to begin their progress through Adelaide's pleasantly ordered streets, which to-day are gaily bedecked.

(PAUSE)

A pause is made in the Royal progress at the War Memorial. (PAUSE)

Met by South Australian Premier Playford and R.S.L. State President Eastick, the party moves down lines of curtsying Legacy children, whilst greying veterans clearly show their affection and loyalty. (PAUSE)

In vivid contrast to the tumultuous city streets, this solemn moment binds the Queen more closely to her people, as she pays tribute to the fallen.

(PAUSE)

For Adelaide a dream come true, as the Queen and Duke drive through the streets in sunshine, and a breeze brisk enough to take liberties with Her Majesty's charming hat!

At Adelaide Oval... to see play in a country carnival match.. scene of so many of Don Bradman's triumphs. The master himself is presented to the Royal couple.

(PAUSE)

Her Majesty seems to have caught some of the Duke's enthusiasm for the game. Hit a run -- straight back to the pavilion.

Description of cut subject : RT/AM/116. (PAGE TWO)

A visit to Whyalla - seaport supplying most of the iron-ore smelted in Australia. For the Queen, however, a demonstration, not of industrial power, but of tribal dancing by aborigines. The Queen is the only woman to whom the aborigines have ever explained the mysteries of a sacred tribal corroboree.

(PAUSE)

Yet, something still seems to puzzle Her Majesty!

(PAUSE)

On Sunday morning the Royal party comes to St. Peter's Cathedral to worship and is met on the steps of the beautiful church by the Bishop of Adelaide, the Right Reverend Brian Robin.

(PAUSE)

Her Majesty's devotion to duty is reflected in her very real and sincere devotion to her Church.

(PAUSE)

An overflow congregation joins in the simple service.

(PAUSE)

Afterwards the Royal visitors chat with the Lord Bishop and his clergy a happy and informal scene that will be treasured with so many other in the memories of the people of South Australia.

Shots of Duke at look-out point having a look through camera, and at various instruments prior to the firing of a rocket.

Cut-in shot of the ground controller of radio-controlled plane.

JINDIVIK.

Shot of rocket being fired and follow up.

X Duke looks through the Kine theodolite.

X The Jindivik radio controlled plane takes off.

X Shots of this plane in the air with a Metoer which controls it from the air.

X Shots of the Duke looking at the works of a Jindivik.

Length of Woomera Range.... 1250 miles ~~W~~ to the Coast.

Rainfall average... 7.3 inches annually. Population about 3000.
