when those end-or-the year hurricanes partly died down Holland began to count the cost. Dykes were breached in 50 places in North Brahant. Two polders were under water. This below-sea-level land, reclaimed at enormous money-and-labour cost, had lost another battle with the North Sea. By a hair's breadth this was not disaster on 1953 scale, but many people were victims for a second time. 10,000 acres of good farmland are under salt water again, 600 people had to from Ridderkerk. Damage is estimated at half-a-million pounds.
