NETHERLANDS WELCOMES  
FIRST USAF UNIT ✓

(Official Air Force Footage Released by Department of Defense)

Assuming new duties under the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, U.S. Air Force personnel of the 512th Fighter Day Squadron arrive at Soesterberg, Holland, the first U.S. Air Force unit to be located in The Netherlands. Equipped with F-86F Sabrejets, the unit will fly side-by-side with Dutch fliers under the operational control of the Royal Netherlands Air Force.

Sequences show:

- (a) A fly over by the jet squadron on their arrival attracts the attention of Dutch men, women and children dressed in native costume. A windmill, typical of the country, makes a picturesque background.
- (b) At the airfield, part of which has been made available to the U.S. Air Force, Colonel Alex Cox, Dutch Air Force greets Lt. Col. Frank M. Haynie, Commanding Officer of the 512th Squadron.
- (c) After extending a warm welcome to their American counterparts, English-speaking Dutch airmen inspect the American jet aircraft.
- (d) Before a massed guard of American and Dutch troops, American Ambassador H. Freeman Matthews transfers the operational control of the U.S. Squadron of F86F Sabrejets to the Royal Netherlands Air Force.
- (e) Mayor of Amsterdam, A.J. d'Ailly unveils a plaque commemorating the arrival of the Americans at their New Amsterdam Camp.

NEW ILLUMINATED SUIT  
MAKES SAFER CARRIER  
LANDINGS POSSIBLE ✓

(Official Navy Footage Released by Department of Defense)

Naval landing signal officers now have new light landing suits and paddles to make safer plane landings on a carrier deck possible at night. The lighted suit and paddles replace the old fluorescent strips illuminated from the deck.

Sequences show:

(a) Light landing suit and paddles as they appear during the daylight.

(b) Only that portion of the suit and paddles to which bulbs are attached is visible at night. The clearly lit outline of the paddles and suit makes it easier for the pilot to follow the landing directions of the signal officer from the carrier deck.
