 - FUCHS SPEAKS "THE CONTINENT IS A VAST AREA ABOUT THE SAME SIZE AS EUROPE AND THE U.S. FUT TOGETHER. WITH THE EXPEDITION OF AMUNDSENS AND SCOTT'S JOURNEY TO THE POLE ONLY THE MARGINAL AREAS ARE KNOWN."
