At the San Fernando colonial hospital the Princess performed another opening ceremony. Trinidad has good reason to me be proud of this institution; Mr. Tang, the Minister of health, told the royal visitor it was the finest hospital in the West Indies. The visit to Trinidad ended all too quickly. Her Royal Highness flew then to Tobago, an island about 20 miles away. She flew in an airlimer of the British West Indies Airline.
