Vickers-Armstrongs, at their Barrow-in-Furness shippard, handed over the destroyer Aragua to the Venezuelan Mavy. The ship is the third destroyer of her class built at Sarrow for Venezuela since the war. When the formalities were sompleted she was received by the Chief of the Venezuelan Maval Commission, Commander Vale.
