FLOODS FOLLOW DANUBE THAW

Much of the lower part of Passau is under water. This ancient town of 34,000 people stands at the confluence

of the Danube and the Rivers Inn and Ilz. When the ice broke the Danube flowed 17-feet above normal level. The

old Max Bridge was in danger.

400 houses are flooded; many more will be affected if
the river continues to rise. Already 1500 people have
had to leave their homes. Passau has been a German
bishopric for more than m 1200 years. It stands near
the Austrian frontier, and many times in its history
has seen its ancient streets deep under water; an historical
fact of no consolation to the present inhabitants. The
damage they suffer can be imagined. Their greatest
hope now is that the river will go down.
