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NEAR BOSTON COMMUTER TRAINS COLLIDE IN BLIZZARD

Tragedy rides the rails in Massachusetts! A train halted outside S. ampscott station, thirteen miles from Boston is rammed by another commuter special in a blizzard. The land car of the second train becomes a mass of rubble. Thirteen are dead, one hundred injured. Ironically, passengers who boarded a train to continue into Boston are involved in another crash, where twenty are injured. Cause of the S. ampscott disaster, says the railroad was "human failure." The engineer of the second train — killed in the accident—violated operating rules. According to officials, he passed two warning signals and a flagman before the fatal collision, worst in New England in nearly 40 years.
