The one-man helicopter needn't be a dream any longer, as himmimmm the American Navy demonstrated here. Allowing 12-stone for the pilot the all-up weight is only 4-and-a-galf cwts. Like all its amazing tribe the machine takes off and lands practically anywhere. And what a turn of speed the 75-h.p. engine produces!

ROTORCYCLE....NAVY'S ONE-MAN 'COFTER

Adaptable to low cost production it is intended for observation, liaison, and small unit tactical assignments. Weighing less than 500 pounds with the pilot aboard, it performs basic helicopter maneuvers, and cruises with ease. The little job is collapsible and can be folded into a small package for transportation.
