1132 m.p.h. Delta II sets World

Peter Twiss got into the conkpit of the fantastic looking Fairey Delta II at Boscombe Down for a world-speed record attempt over a nine mile course between Chichester and Ford, Sussex. Special photographic equiphent was used for timing over two runs. Twiss flew at 38,000 feet, more than 7-miles up.

Only 23 minutes after the take-off the Delta II was back at Boscombe Down.

Average speed for the two runs was 1132 m.p.h.,/300 faster than the figure set by an American Super Abre last August. Later on Peter Twiss was interviewed in company with Group Captain Slade, Fairey's Chief test pilot.

The record is an achievement of which Brita in is rightly Proud.
