The exquisite minhibatetamilanh Elvin, a Russian, they knew by reputation, and Mr. in his turn Khruschev/quite lavished praise on Beryl Grey. Dame Margot Fonteyn was presented. Her portrayal of the princess in Swan Lake deserved the highest praise. The magic of the ballet had cast its spell; for the moment world affairs were forgetten.

Airport next day when B and K flew to Scotland, where
Palace
another very busy day lay before them. At the Rahmann
of Holyroodhouse they saw the state rooms and, for the

At Edinburgh Castle bands of the Royal Scots played in their hogour. B and K took the salute at the march past.

Soon after eleven that night, at the Foreign Office, Sir Anthony and Marshal Bulganin signed the joint communique. Both governments undertook to support

United Mations peace-efforts in the Palestine region. Both would continue disarmament efforts. Russia agreed to buy from Fritain goods to the value of nearly £1,000m., if strategis controls were lifted. Neither government has given way on the question of Germany's future.

Mr. Khruschev were in Britain all difficulties between two countries would vanish. But it was the first meeting of its kind and the general verdict seems to be, well worth while.
