

SHAKESPEARE BREATHS AGAIN

In St. Nicholas, Chislehurst, the tomb of ^{the Elizabethan} Sir Thomas

Walsingham was opened at the request of

20 the American writer Mr. Calvin Hoffman. His researches
make him believe that ~~man~~ plays attributed to Shakespeare
were written by Marlowe, whose patron was Walsingham.

Hoffman thought the tomb might contain First Folio

35 manuscripts proving ^{them} ~~him~~ to be Marlowe's ~~man~~ work. However,
