

ANTI-POLIO VACCINE.

Middlesex County Council are expected to be the first to start vaccinating children with the anti-polio serum. Next Tuesday, about 75 children will be injected at the

Middlesex County Council's Central Hendon Clinic,
The Barrroughs, Hendon.

which is at the rear of the Public Library.

Injections will commence at 10 a.m. the doctor in charge being a lady, Mrs. Bedkin. In attendance will be the well-known authority on polio, Mr. S. Graham Rowlinson, former chairman of the Middlesex Health Board and chairman of the Infantile Paralysis Fellowship. He will be in a wheelchair & tell the children what polio can do.

Movistons are visiting the clinic to-morrow (Friday) to arrange the lighting. The P.R.O. to contact on the spot is Mr. Mc.Cloughton. Movistons are using a silent camera for the vaccinations proper and a sound camera for interviews.

It is our new British anti-polio vaccine and I would like to pay a warm tribute to the scientists, doctors and laboratory technicians whose arduous work has produced it and to thank the staff who are doing the actual inoculations.

Every precaution has been taken and none will be used that has not taken all the tests, and the tests are stringent, and I can assure parents that this vaccine is as safe as any vaccine can be and they need have no worries on that score.

One of the questions parents have been asking me is - is the vaccine absolutely safe? Every possible precaution has been taken and none will be issued that has not passed the most stringent tests and I can assure parents that this vaccine will be as safe as any vaccine can be and they may have no worries on that score. But I must make it clear that there is no guarantee that a child that has had the

vaccine will not catch polio this summer, but the chances will be greatly reduced, and in particular, there will be less risk of permanent paralysis, and, after all, it is the paralysis that we want

I am very sorry that we shall not be able, at the present time, to vaccinate all that have been registered. We may not be able to vaccinate more than one in four, but they will have the first chance when we start again this Autumn, and I hope that we shall have much greater
