SIR ANTHONY EDEN PRESENTED WITH THE FREEDOM OF THE CITY OF PERTH

At Perth on the 13th day of May, 1956, in special meeting of the Lord Provost, magistrates and councillors of the city and the Royal Burgh of Perth, James Alexander Smart presiding.

Which day the said Lord Provost, magistrates and councillors did in presence of resolution come to a meeting of the Town Council, held on the 27th day of December, 1955, admit the Right Honourable Sir Anthony Eden, Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, - - - - - , member of Parliament, as an honorary Burgess of the City and Royal Burgh of Perth, and did present him with the freedom of the City in recognition of his constant endeavour to secure peace among the nations of the world, and of the great respect in which he is held by the citizens of Perth.
