	At the end of hostilities in Korea, by mutual agreement the Demilitarized Zone was formed stretching across the entire width of Korea. This Zone, about 2 1/2 miles wide is divided in the center by the Military Demarcation Line. The southern half is patrolled by			
	Allied Forces and the northern half by Communist Forces. The Demarcation Zone Civil Police Co., the forward observers of the US Forces in Korea, daily patrol the sector from the western border of Korea to the Semi Chon Valley, 21 miles east. The remainder of the			
	area along the Demarcation Zone to the east is manned by Republic of Korea Army. It is the job of the US Patrols to warn troops in the front line defense positions of any acts of attempted aggression by Communist Forces.			
	Patrols carry out their mission of watchfulness from several observation posts which give the patrols a clear view of the Communist sector for several miles. Each observation is noted and reported to the Operation Section of the Co. They also keep a			
	constant vigil for persons attempting to cross the line to preclude incidents arising between the two sides. Uncleared mine fields in the area are marked for safety. Once a week a patrol walks the entire 21 miles along the Demarcation Line to check communication			
	wires and markings. Soldiers who go on patrols are hand picked. Physical condition is stressed due to the amount of climbing and walking that is done while on patrol. The men are aware of the importance of their work			
	and are proud of the job they have been assigned.
