

Joe Stalin must have turned in his grave when into Moscow came President Tito, the man he vowed to crush. Now, as honoured guest of Bulganin and Khrushchev, the only satellite leader who ever defied Russia was warmly welcomed to the Soviet Union. It was more evidence of the present rulers' reversal of Stalin's policy. Perhaps the Russian people in their hearts admire Tito for the tremendous courage he showed in rebelling against the Red rule years ago. The cruiser Helli brought to Toulon the King and Queen of Greece. King Paul and Queen Frederica were beginning their four-day state visit to France at a time when Greece is very much in the international picture through the troubles in Cyprus. Formalities over the King and Queen left for Paris.

And in the capital, at the Elysee palace President Coty welcomed his guests. The French appreciated that King Paul has brought <sup>economic recovery</sup> ~~peace~~ to Greece since he came to the throne nine years ago. They admire also his smart and attractive wife, Queen Frederika. Inside the palace M. Coty presented members of the government to the royal visitors, for whom it was the beginning of the hospitality for which the French have unrivalled genius.

Cyprus. After a swoop on villages in the Paphos Mountain area British troops brought back to temporary headquarters the haul of ammunition they found. A little time before Sir John Harding became Governor some military stores had been raided, the origin of most of the weapons and ammunition now recovered. Sir John believes that no more than 150 rebels are behind the terror campaign and that when they are rounded up peace will be restored.
