STRONG MAN ANDERSON SETS THREE WEIGHT-LIFTING RECORDS

In this Olympic year, Uncle Sam weighs in with a sure-fire winner in the person of weightlifter Paul Anderson. Anderson, the magnificent -- here lifting 400 pounds in the press; which gives him title number one at the National A.A.U. championships at Philadelphia.

Six-two weighing 325 pounds, Anderson exceeds his own weight in the snatch lift, 335 pounds, for a world record.

The clean-and-jerk lift ....440 pounds--another world record.

His total-lift mark of eleven hundred seventy-five pounds is good for a third world mark. Anderson himself loses 5 pounds.

But that hardly bothers the 24-year-old heavyweight lifting champion!

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
