

RECORDS SET AT HOME AND ABROAD

Berlin. U.S. coloured soldier Willie Williams set a new world 100-metre record in 10.1 seconds, one-tenth of a second faster than Jesse Owens' time in 1936.

Next day another U.S. soldier, Ira ~~Murchison~~^{Murchison}, also ran the 100 metres in 10.1. *Bravo Willie Was* Meanwhile in London, great Britain defeated Czechoslovakia in the match sponsored by the News of the World. In the three-mile race Ibbotson and Norris opposed Graf and Kristof.
