Please be advised that the following arrangements have been made in regard to coverage of events connected with the present Suez Canal emergency:-

THURSDAY, AUGUST 9TH - W. Reeves: Army vehicles waiting for shipment at Newport, Mon. Film due in tonight for normal release and shipment.

A. Farmer: First Suez Canal Company evacuees arrive at London Airport. Film due in tonight for normal release and shipment.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 10TH - R. Cathles: Trooplift in Britannias, Hurn Airport, a.m. Troopships Empire Ken and Dilwara leave Southampton, p.m. Mr. Cathles will bring back the film himself Friday evening and turn it into the laboratory for development and for the making of one blueprint for New York which Mr. Hall will ship on Saturday.

A. Farmer: Trooplift from Blackbushe. Film for inclusion in the current issue and for normal shipment.

W. Reeves: Secretary of US. Navy arrives London Airport. Film due in Friday evening for normal release and shipment.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 12TH - A. Farmer: Troopship Danera leaves Southampton. Film for normal release and shipment.
