## RECORD NUMBER OF HELICOPTERS AT LEE-ON-SOLENT "AIR DAY"

Probably the largest number of helicopters ever to take part in a public display in Britain will be seen at the "Air Day" to be held at the Royal Naval Air Station at Lee-on-Solent (Hants) on Saturday, 11th August.

From anti-submarine, search and rescue and experimental and training squadrons of the Fleet Air Arm, some forty Whirlwind, Dragonfly, Hiller and Skeeter helicopters are to take part in flying demonstrations. Fixed wing Naval aircraft, ranging from the now obsolete Swordfish to modern Wyverns and Sea Hawks, will also be in the air and on the ground.

The "Air Day" at Lee-on-Solent is in aid of Naval charities.
