

BUTLIN CHANNEL SWIM RACE

Twenty-nine Competitors for mass start on Sunday
AUGUST 12th 1956.



Never before have so many people sent in applications wanting to swim the English Channel. They claim that the Channel, because of its length and difficulties, is the most testing long distance swim in the World. Open to swimmers of any Nationality, Billy Butlin and his Swim Committee finally selected twenty-nine top line swimmers, the greatest number ever to compete for the thousand guinea Butlin Challenge Cup and £1,900 in cash prizes made up as follows:-

THE SWIM

The Race Headquarters is the Folkestone Swimming Pool, where the Press Office will be established and available for all press information daily from Wednesday August 1st until after completion of the swim.

The swimmers will leave the Folkstone Beach in an armada of over sixty boats at about 5.30 p.m. on Sunday afternoon August 12th for Cap Griz Nez, when they will enter the water in a mass start about midnight. It is expected that some of the first swimmers across will be landing on the English shores around 2 p.m. on Monday afternoon August 13th.

COMMUNICATIONS

The Control Ship will be the steam yacht "WENDORIAN" a vessel of 120 tons from the King Edward VII Nautical College. She will have a full time professional crew and carry about ten cadets from the College for training. The "WENDORIAN" is equipped with Decca Radar Navigator, visual echo sounder and Pye Marine radiotelephone.

In addition the Swim Controller will be aboard this vessel together with Captain Austin Davies, official navigator appointed by Trinity House, and the Operations Room will be manned by the 21st S.A.S. Regiment (Artists Rifles).

All vessels escorting the swimmers, will carry a Signaller of this Regiment equipped with V.H.F. radio and will be in constant touch with progress reports to the "WENDORIAN".

The Press Office at Folkestone will have a direct two way Radio link with the Control Ship "WENDORIAN" and up to date reports will be available to the press on shore. Arrangements can also be made for any special communique to be received by individual Press Reporters.

BOAT RESERVATIONS

FOR PRESS

Any press or film Reporters requiring a boat reservation should make an application as soon as possible to the Press Officer after August 1st.

Organiser of the race, Billy Butlin will have at his disposal throughout the swim, two fast Speed Boats for Fress and Film liason work.

TRAINING

All the swimmers will be in full training at the Folkestone Pool and in the sea from August 1st onwards, and will be officially welcomed by the Mayor of Folkestone and Mr.Butlin at a Swimming Gala on Friday evening August 10th when they will all be available for advance press stories, films and photographs.
