SUEZ CRISIS

Army vehicles were paint-sprayed with desert colouring at Netley, Hampshire, before being loaded for shipment abroad. Almost as work was proceeding came the 'reply' of Colonel Nasser that he would see Mr. Menzies and the Committee appointed at the end of the Suez Conference. There was great activity at Southampton as embarkation went forward. So considerable was the pressure on quayside space that the King George V dry dock was flooded to make room for further loading.

Colonel Nasser, while agfeeing to meet the Menzies Committee, says he is not thereby committed to changing in his policy. However, it is good progress to have secured a meeting. Megnwhile the proper military insurance is being taken out.
