<u>Roll 1 of 2</u>	<p>H.M.S Albion - aircraft carrier leaves Portsmouth Dockyard ---- see handout.</p> <p>* GV Aircraft carrier THESEUS in Dockyard.* Various scenes on dockside, sailors and marines waving, relatives waving etc, ship leaves - moves off right, turns in mid-dock, then sails out to left past HMS Theseus, and group of officers on dock headed by CinC Portsmouth, Admiral of the Fleet, Sir George Creasy.</p> <p>GV of Transports lying at anchor in Cowes Roads.</p>
<u>Roll 2 of 2</u>	<p>Various views of transports in Cowes Roads, most with deck cargoes of lorries (no tanks etc visible), and <u>some riding high in water as if unladen</u>. Names of transports are;</p> <p>Parkgate, Cornish City, Benwannoeh, Windsor, Baguenay Terminals, Hantsland, North Britain, River Crest, Empire Doric, Empire Gaelic, Sandsend, Barnspalm, Kenilworth Castle, Chandler, Egidia, Benwyvis, and one other.</p> <p>No life visible aboard, except duty officers on bridges.
