The Story of the last voyage of the Pourquoi Pas? --- bearing Dr Charcot, France's greatest Polar explorer to Greenland on a rescue expedition --- this is one that will take its place among the annals that tell of those who give their lives in the cause of science. These pictures, sent back during the rescue trip, show the iceberg-studded seas through which the ~~gallant~~ little ship made her way. After the normal hardships and hazards of this kind of voyage the Pourquoi Pas? was overtaken by a tremendous storm when only 100 yards from the Icelandic coast. Dr Charcot and all his crew of 30 save one were lost.
