These races are the classic event in the yachting world --- the winner is acknowledged to be the fastest sailing craft that man can produce. It is sad to recall that no British yacht has ever won since the races were inaugurated sixty-seven years ago. / Endeavour II is owned by Mr T.O.M. Sopwith, who is his own helmsman, and his Endeavour I won two of the races in 1934. ~~Both Ranger and Endeavour measure nearly 110 feet over all and carry a crew of about thirty. Each man is trained to the minute, and yachting in this class is an exact science.~~ If Endeavour should beat Ranger in the majority of the remaining races it would be an achievement of unparalleled glory --- we wish them a fair breeze and lots of luck.
