Flying above the dark waters of the Potomac River, our aerial cameraman looks down upon a race of speedboats. It is Washington and the race is for the President's Cup. Each heat is fifteen miles, and the champions are all cut to win. Impshi, Notre Dame and Juno are all well-known in the American speed game, and it's

Notre Dame that wins to-day. But for the spectators, it's not the winner that gives the thrills --- it's the loser who goes all out — watch the out out the milk

And now for speed on land. Tanks used to be clumsy, lumbering giants doing about eight miles an hour, but now they go like greyhounds. This is bircle Sames regular army Light Infantry, although they seem more like country. Anyone using this road had better keep to the cycle track.
