out of the morning sky comes the leaders of squadrons of bombers, sworn to raze the capital to the ground. Terrified inhabitants scurry through the main streets --- civilians filled with the sickening certainty that the fate of hundreds in Shanghai is about to overwhelm them. There are bomb-proof shelters, here but not enough. The hospital is plainly marked as a warning to the squadrons above. And then --- the series of raids that lasted from 10.0 clock in the morning until five o'clock in the evening, began their work of massacre. Chinese gunners examined as a father got the range, and a Japanese raider was brought down in flames.

The raid is over. Bombs had fallen on the hospital a railway station, where a refugee train had been waiting, became a shambles horrible beyond belief.

Some of the Japanese airmen were captured after a forced landing Mme. Chiang Kai Shek, whife of the Chinese Generalissimo, declares that China will fight to the end. A General Ku-Chi-Kung followed up her words by massing his men for a major battle to defend Shanghai. The war goes on.
