All were starving, and they were given food. As they eat, their faces are a mixture of despair and relief / The trawler was set adrift. With useless engines she would endanger shipping, and she was sunk by the Southampton a gunfire, before the refugees were taken abhore to safety maxpanent in a land of peace.
