The National Hunt Steeplechase is the Grand National of the Amateur jockey, and the weather gave them a grand day of glorious sunshine. / The four-mile course at Cheltenham is picturesque but gruelling, nevertheless it attracted a big field of twenty-six to be seen including There were many notabilities the Walter Gilbey but his famous curly-brimmed hat had some tough opposition. They're off --- a good start got the whole of the cavalcade away in purfect formation and they charged the first jump without a single casualty For a four-mile gallop the field kepy amazingly well together and sixteen of the twenty-six finished the course. Every jump they took with unfailing regr precision -up with the leaders are Stalhridge Park, Young Mischief and St George 11 the Second. Rudolf IV is there too. Nearing the end of the long testing race there's still a whole squadron going string and it's impossible to pick the likely winner. Once again the jump is taken in perfect style but now it's neck or nothing -it's neck --- no. it's nothing!

Coming up to the last fence St George II and Young Mischief are leading from Rudolph IV and Stalbridge Park, but the last two came up and now see a smashing finish --- almost a dead heat with three at the post. But St George II was thexainer a head winner from Rudolph with Stalbridge Parks being
