Warplanes of the Allied Air Force played their part in the mix withdrawal. R.A.F. fighters were constantly in the air beating off the attacking bombers with huge losses to the enemy. But they were heavily cutnumbered. This action brings home more clearly then ever the need for more and more planes. There was not a man nor a machine in the Royal Air Force that did not perform superlative feats of arms in this battle. But there were not enough. We must have double, three times and four times our present strength in the air. And if we work we know we can

Now to Dunkirk. In the port were ships of every shape and size, taking off the men of the B.E.F. and their French comrades.

********************* And once again the Navy has earned undying gratitude. Under a hail of shell-fire and bombing and machine-guns the warships sent over a terrifif barrage of protection.

Dunkirk was still holding out while tens of thousands of our troops embarked for Britain. Tugsm trawlers, pleasure steamers --- little ships of all kinds came out loaded with soldiers --- battle-worn, dog-tired, hungry but undefeated.

Their spirit was never broken. Their ranks were solid to the end. And they inflicted terrible losses on the enemy as they fought every inch of the ways road back.
