The Commonwealth Repatriation Centre, in Korea, greets another twenty-four British Prisoners from a North Korean camp. Men from this camp had been accused by the Reds of anti-Communist activities - but now they return to a bagpipe welcome.

The men suffered weeks of rigorous treatment because they organised escape committees and refused to attend lectures on the benefits of Communism.

A wonderful day, too, for Mr Edgar Sanders, arriving at Croydon Airport, after being released from an Hungarian Prison. He served over three years of a thirteen year sentence for alleged espionage...

Escorted by ^{his 3 daughters and} his wife (who wrote personally to the President of Hungary and secured her husband's release) ~~and his family~~ - Mr Sanders hopes to celebrate his freedom with a holiday.
