Starting from the cockpit in Hyde Park, 59 international cross-country wheelers set off on the Daily Express 1624-mile racing tour of Britain.

And soon they're well away- heading for Great Yarmouth

~~Passing through Norfolk, they are 50 miles from London.~~

Nearing Thetford- there's a chance to pick up light refreshments. First day's winner ^{WAS} Italy's Bruno Monti- who covered the 124 miles from London- in just over five hours.

The next day- they're on the road again, making for Peterboro', ~~and passing through Suffolk, there are 17 miles to go, before the next~~

~~it's~~, it's Luciano Ciancola- up in first place. Before leaving Yarmouth, this young Italian- who was just behind his team-mate Monti on the first day- injured his arm in a fall.

Leaving Peterboro' behind, the roadsters have a time-trial over another 39 miles to Leicester- with riders starting off alone at minute intervals. Belgium won this time-trial, but the long race round ~~Britain~~ Britain continues.
