Earthquake in Cyprus

Cyprus becomes another victim of the earthquake scourge - and these, the first pictures to reach Britain, show some extent of the damage. The disaster followed in the wake of recent upheavals - and - as in the Ionian Islands - the Royal Navy was quickly on the spot - with much-needed relief for the hapless victims.

At least forty people were killed and more than a hundred seriously injured in the worst earth tremors Cyprus has known.
